Interpretation of Site	Heritage Inventory Interpretation: Dairy and house probably first built and owned by Jim Brown who took up land after 1880s-1890s subdivision. Dairy is still extant but original Kemp Homestead has now been moved closer to Plenty River on Ashly Park property. relocation likely to have taken place in 1936-37.
Archaeological Significance	Site has archaeological potential to contain deposits associated with construction/use of farm complex buildings..
Historical Significance	Moderate to low significance under this criterion as the history of the complex is not uncommon in this area.
