History

Heritage Inventory History of Site: Lots 59, 60, 65 and 66 section L, parish of Dargalong were selected by Robert Patterson who obtained the grant on 29/12/1874. The East Goulburn Main Channel was constructed as part of the Goulburne Murray Scheme with the Nagambie Reservoir in the 1880's. The channel included several siphons beneath creeks which became the focus of activity. The ruins probably relate to this.
