Interpretation of Site	The site comprises a very concentrated dump of early 20th century domestic rubbish and its presence in the Killawarra State Forest is consistent with the remains of a very short term logging camp. As a result sub-surface archaeological remains are less likely.
Archaeological Significance	This artefact dump is not significant and appears to be a short term depositional area.
Historical Significance	The site is significant through its association with 20th century logging camps and/or other similarly ephemeral camps.

History

There is no information regarding the site in general histories of Wangaratta and/or any Parish Plans.

It is known that as a part of a program of protecting Box-Ironbark forests throughout Victoria, the Killawarra State Forest became part of the Warby Range-Ovens River National Park in 2002. Prior to this, the forest was heavily logged for its Ironbark and any settlement in the area was likely to be associated with this occupation
