## History

A Naval College Jetty was located at this site around 1905 and was still there as late as 1933. Baths were added to the northern side of the pier sometime around 1919. The pier was still extant in the 1950s but had either been demolished or incorporated into land reclamation as part of the St Helens Marina.
