## Physical Description 1

The Eastern Oval Grand Stand is situated at the eastern end of the oval beside the Yarrowee River Channel. Seating is organised in four sections, with the three aisles being echoed in the roof form by gablets projecting from the otherwise simple skillion roof. The roof structure is supported by slender cast iron columns, which are paired at the three sets of steps, coinciding with the aisles.

The brackets at the head of the columns are most unusual; being composed of triangulated timber members while between the bottom of the columns, cast iron balustrading, (of quite late design) is employed.

The grandstand, whilst not in the same class as the City Oval grandstand, has some interesting detailing which makes the building notable.
