

## **Physical Description 1**

Little information is known regarding this building. There was a Carriers Arms Hotel on this site from 1863 until 1968 when the licence was surrendered. The building is imposing for its size and projecting turret block. The face brickwork has unfortunately been painted.

The three level verandah with cast iron work is of interest, and provides a North American primitive element to the composition.

The building provides an important strectscape element due to its size and relative intactness and represents an unusual combination of elements.
