## **Physical Description 1**

This two-'storied rendered brick house could be that referred to in the Australasian Building Contractors News 17 September 1887 when James and Piper Architects, had completed a two-storey brick residence Joseph Phillips in Victoria Street.

The house is of two interesting gables. The gable presenting to the street has a projecting bay window on the ground floor with a single double-hung window above with an intricate label mould terminating in a triangular motif with a shield. Above this is a circular vent with quatrefoil insert, with a semi-circular label mould terminating in foliated bosses.

The upper windows in the other section have simple square label moulds.

There is a simple verandah now partly glazed.
