Statement of Significance

Apart from the Myrtle ford Camp 5, Rodney and Waranga Shires possessed the only internment and prisoner-of-war camp sites in Victoria: as such these camp sites are of potential State significance as sole representatives of this little publicized aspect of Home Front activity during World War Two. Rodney Shire, in contrast to Waranga, has more tangible internment sites (Tatura Camp 1, Murchison Camp 13), where gateways and some structure remnants survive, the gateways being expressive of the interned nationalities in each camp. One of the camp huts also survives, in good repair, close to the Murchison northern town boundary. Nevertheless, given Waranga Shire's dearth of obvious sites, it is clear that high local importance falls upon the market garden and associated

hut, as well as State-wide interest.

Typical gabled corrugated iron-clad hut probably from the Murchison Camp 13, since converted to provide part of a scout hall.

The Former Internment Camp Hut, at River Road, is a typical gabled corrugated iron-clad hut probably from the Murchison Camp 13. Apart from the Myrtle ford Camp 5, Rodney and Waranga Shires possessed the only internment and prisoner-of-war camp sites in Victoria. As such these camp sites represent a little publicized aspect of Home Front activity during the Second World War. The Hut has since been converted to provide part of a scout hall.
