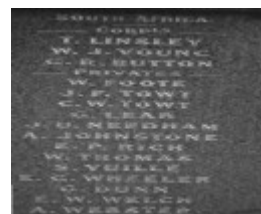

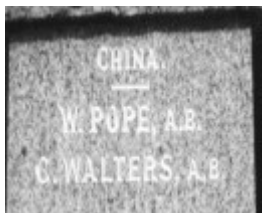

The Box Hill Boer War and Boxer Rebellion Memorial comprises of an obelisk, drinking fountain and streetlights. The structures were erected in memory of those who served the Boer War, South Africa (1899-1902) and the Boxer Rebellion in China (1900-1901). The memorials unveiled by the Hon. A. J. Peacock, Premier of Victoria, on 21st January 1902. The obelisk lists the names of twenty-six fallen and returned individuals (Privates and Corporals from the Nunawading district) who fought in the Boer War, and two who fought in China. The memorial was originally located at Station Street and Whitehorse Road, Box Hill, but is now at Watts Street and Whitehorse Road.
