History

GEELONG RAILWAY LINE WAS THE FIRST TO BE CONSTRUCTED IN VICTORIA BY THE GEELONG &

MELBOURNE RAILWAY CO AND IN OPERATION AFTER 1857. ALSO THE ORIGINAL ROUTE TO BALLARAT THE RAILWAY WAS RECONSTRUCTED DURING THE 1870S AND UPGRADED SEVERAL TIMES AFTER THAT. (CEKALOVIC, 2002:54) (WAREL & ASSOC, 1982:157)
