Low scientific significance - poor condition and limited potential. Local historical significance - possibly used as a local watering-hole and horse-changing station, though more research is required.

Interpretation of Site	Site recommended for further detailed historical research. House constructed pre-1870 and may have operated as a pub and horse-changing station on Murchison-Shepparton route. Post-1870, the house was purchased by the Maloney family after which time it became the family home.

History

Local informant and landowner Bill Heath said that the built homestead was purchased by his great-grandfather Mr Maloney. According to Mr Heath, prior to the Maloney purchase the site was used as a local watering-hole and horse-changing station. Site clearly constructed pre-1870. Site burnt down by tenants in the 1970s.
