History

Allotment 93, Parish Moorpanyal was originally purchased by John McWirther in 1849. John Calvert bought the property in 1859; teneders were advertised in this year for the construction of a bluestone homestead, stables, gates and gatehouse. John Calvert died in 1875 and the property was left to his family who remained there until 1906. The Geelong Presbyterian Girls College (Morongo) purchased the school in 1926. It was closed in 1994.

The gatehouse was demolished in the 1970s and was derelict by this time. In 1996, Kardinia International School began operation which continues.
