"Dominey's Hall" at 801 Mt Alexander Road, Moonee Ponds, was built in 1888 for the Essendon rate collector George Dominey. It is historically and aesthetically important. It is historically important (Criterion A) as an unusual building type, which was used combining residence and hall for a period.

A hip roofed polychrome brick villa with concave cast iron verandah and hipped slate roof having an unusual wing extending to the street frontage accommodating "Dominey's Hall" and being so signed in cast cement above the doorway and window. The parapet treatment is in cement stucco with urns and a central curved pediment. The side of the projecting former hall has a patterned stringcourse relieving the blandness of this elevation.

Condition: Sound. Integrity: Medium, verandah removed.
