# **Extent of Registration**

St Luke's is the oldest known church to have been designed by Vahland and Getzschmann. The original design included a 26 meter tower to be built on the north side when sufficient funds became available. They never became available. In 1986 a vestry and foyer were added to the church. A conscientious attempt has been made to reflect the character of the existing church. The terracotta roof tiles are not original and reflect an earlier generation's desire for modernization. There is some fine stained glass at St Luke's.
