Place history is essentially unknown. It is assumed that the stone hut was associated with the squatting period or early freehold estate of Eurambeen and was constructed in the mid-1800s.

Long Gully Road Hut has local historic significance as an early example of rural life and development of the land.

Archaeological Significance

The site has been assessed having high archaeological potential. Ruined stone huts from the pastoral history of the region dating to the mid-1800s are relatively rare. The Long Gully Road Hut has potential to provide information on the pastoral life of workers from this

period.

Historical Significance Long Gully Road Hut has local historic significance as an early example of rural life and development of the land.

Interpretation of Site

Currently, only surface structural features are known and there is no evidence of different phases, functions, activities or development of the site. Since it was likely constructed and used in the mid-1800s, it is assumed that is was used as a Shepherds Hut, Boundary Rider's Hut or Outstation.
