A.M.D.G. In honour of Sailors Soldiers Airmen and Nurses who gave their lives for their King and Country in World War II and also those who served.

Memorial Window Description & History

St. Michael was one of the most popular commemorative subjects for stained glass windows. The archangel's status as a warrior saint resonated with families and parishioners wishing to honour their sons. The Melbourne stained glass firm, Mathieson & Gibson, was especially skilled in the use of silver stain to create the golden armour of *St. Michael* and they adapted it for other commemorative windows in churches across Victoria, including at Tyrendarra, Geelong and Hawthorn in Victoria and at Claremont, WA.
