Memorial Window Description & History

Nicholas Draffin noted that this window was the last of the six memorials to be erected. Despite its title, *The Risen Christ*, it has elements of the *Creation of Man* in the vertical borders at either side of the central images. A full list of the men and women who served in the First and Second World Wars is included as an appendix to Nan Phillips, *A Centenary History of St. Stephen's Gardenvale*.
