STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hume and Hovell monument adjacent to 106 Rennie Street fronting Princes Freeway is **historically** significant at a **STATE** level. It is associated with the explorers, Hume and Hovell, and their explorations that helped lead to the development of European settlement in Australia.

The Hume and Hovell monument adjacent to 106 Rennie Street fronting Princes Freeway is **scientifically** significant at a **LOCAL** level. It illustrates craftsmanship in the rough-faced granite obelisk, pedestal, capping and base.

The Hume and Hovell monument adjacent to 106 Rennie Street fronting Princes Freeway is **socially** significant at a **LOCAL** level. It is recognised and valued by the community for historical and cultural reasons.

Overall, the Hume and Hovell monument adjacent to 106 Rennie Street fronting Princes Freeway is of **LOCAL** significance.

## **Physical Description 1**

The unpainted memorial adjacent to 106 Rennie Street fronting Princes Freeway consists of a crafted rough-faced granite obelisk supported by a projection rough-faced granite capping, tapered rough-faced pedestal and flat, rough-faced granite base. The monument reads:

"Expedition 17th December 1824

Hume and Hovell

17th December 1924

Henry Angel, William Bollard,

Claude Bossawa, Thomas Boyde
