The house at no. 16 Brewster street, Essendon was built in 1904. It is aesthetically important (Criterion E) as an example of the Federation period villas for which Melbourne's middle class suburbs are noted and is distinguished by the juxtaposition of unusual decorative elements in the Arts and Crafts manner, foreshadowing later stylistic developments.

Physical Description 1

A large single storeyed Federation period villa with dominant half timbered and rough cast gable ends surmounting leadlit bayed windows. Openings include a lunette shaped window whilst the porch verandah is bracketed in the manner of later bungalow verandahs having massive timber posts on piers with Arts and Crafts influenced brackets. There is an atypical faceted projecting wing.
