The house at 200 Maribyrnong Road, Moonee Ponds was built for William Miller in 1913. It is of historic and aesthetic importance. It is historically important (Criterion A) for its capacity to demonstrate along with other examples of its type the attraction of the Maribyrnong Road as a residential location around the time of the Great War and following the opening of the electric tramway service to the Maribyrnong River in October, 1906. It is aesthetically important as a highly picturesque timber villa of its type, the corner tower being a noteworthy and highly visible element in the surrounding streetscape.

Physical Description 1

A picturesque Federation period villa having a corner tower with encircling faceted verandah, half timbered gable ends, a steeply pitched slate roof with terra cotta ridge cresting and a curved ladder frame frieze to the turned timber posted verandah. The projecting wings that terminate the verandah have bayed windows whilst the projecting gable ends are supported by decorative timber brackets in the manner of the period. The composition is characteristic of the time with the corner tower giving dramatic emphasis to the diagonal axis.
