Architecturally, an original successfully designed and large example of the neo-Tudor style which contributes to a detached villa precinct (Riversview Estate, Leslie Road): of regional importance.

Historically, little is known of the Gibbs family.

A large, neo-Tudor clinker brick and unpainted rough-cast (self-coloured?) stucco, gabled roof house. The Marseilles pattern roof tiles are blended in colour; as is the clinker brick fence, and the surrounding landscape is mature and original. Other examples of this type may be seen in Heidelberg, Kew, Hawthorn, Camberwell and Toorak. Generally original.

Streetscape

Atypical in period to the balance of Leslie Street, but possesses the detached, set-back form, the gabled tiled roofs, rough-cast stuccoed walls and surrounding mature landscape.
