Architecturally, a prominent. and generally complete example of an uncommon suburban villa form, usually related specifically to ecclesiastical residences. However it has been severely compromised by the painting of the brickwork: of regional interest and high local importance.

Historically, recognisable as a church residence (although short lived) and the home of locally prominent persons, one linked with rural production: of local importance and regional interest.

Physical Description 1

An asymmetrically planned, domestic Gothic revival styled, slated and gabled roof two storey house, with a two-level cast-iron verandah. The walls are of face brick (now painted) with cemented quoins whilst other detail include the trussed gable and the suitable ecclesiastical, pointed-arch windows. Remnants of the former garden survive.

The picket fence has been replaced; the bricks have been painted and some additions made at the rear

Physical Description 2

Streetscape

A major corner element on one of the old Essendon township allotment (undivided at construction) but isolated in the streetscape. However relates to the other large 19th century mansions nearby which are apparent, because of their scale, above the subsequent development. (eg 6 Aberfeldie Street and 22 Vida Street).
