The site of Caversham Heights is of significance to the Cardinia Shire because of its link with the development of the dairying industry in the area. Although the 1879 residence has gone, the site is significant for its associations with the Kitchen Brothers. These important district pioneers bought large land holdings and played a major role in the development of orcharding and dairying within the shire.

Remnants of the original residence survive at the site, such as concrete and stone door steps, early plantings (pines), decorative iron gates (currently not hanging at site inspection Feb 2015), a brick well with rounded concrete top, and flattened area where the tennis court was located. The stone drain beneath the access road near the c1950s stables may also be early.
