Physical Description 1

A row of mature Canary Island Palms (*Phoenix Canariensis*) in Roughead Street, Leongatha facing the intersection of Anderson street. the palms are part of the planting of small park that once contained a band rotunda constructed by James T Knox (now demolished). Other plantings include privet hedges along the perimeter. The park is at the western edge of the Leongatha Railway Station reserve.
