The complex is of low archaeological significance. Farm complexes are common in the region and better examples survive nearby. The machinery and fencing styles are of historical interest.

Interpretation of Site	Yeoman farm taken up after 1869 Grant Land Act which allowed 320 acres. Thatched shed appears to date from 1870's as does some of the fencing in the sheep yard. Original farm homestead is not extant.

History

Farm taken up by J. Cozens after the 1869 Grant Land Act which allowed farmers to lease 320 acres, then, after

improvements purchased the land. The wide variety of fencing (at least six styles noted) suggests resourcefulness and adaptation to the environment. Thatched sheds were a common form of farm structure in the region. It is not known whether the original farm failed, however the property is within a functioning farm.
