REVISED STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE, CONTEXT, 2010

### *What is significant?*

The c1939 stone house and the site to a radius of 30 metres.

**How is it significant?**

The house is historically and technically significant to the Shire of Nillumbik.

**Why is it significant?**

The house is historically significant because it was built and occupied by Danila Vassilief, the well-known artist and teacher at the local Koorong Experimental School (Criterion H). The house is technically significant because it is constructed of the local mudstone (Criteria F & E).
