Historical Significance	The site is historically significant as the first Roman Catholic Church in Portland. Associated with Mary Mackillop who joined the church in 1862.

History

The brick chapel constructed in 1849 was demolished in 1980. The bluestone church constructed in 1857, and the tower was added in 1877/78. Mary Mackillop joined the church with her family in 1862.
