Statement of Significance

Built in 1902 for Mrs Matilda Reid, Marlborough House is one of a number of distinctive buildings in the area constructed by W J Croad. Significant for its use of local rubble limestone with red brick dressings around door and window openings and at the corners, the simplicity of the building's symmetrical composition is considerably enhanced by the vertical lines of the two storey inset timber verandah decorated with pocket balustrades and a square lattice frieze at ground floor level. Marlborough House was a leading guest house in one of Victoria's most popular and important tourist and resort centres.
