Archaeological
Significance

This site is of high archaeological significance as a rare example of a whaling site in Victoria containing intact deposits.

Historical Significance	This site is historically significant as part of the first permanent settlement in Victoria. Also assoc. with an Aboriginal massacre site and it's occupation by the Gundidjmara eople, representing evidence of early contact & conflict with Aboriginal populations.

History

One of Victoria's first whaling stations, established by the Henty family during the late 1830's with activities diversifying by mid 1840. Records of conflict with local Aboriginal populations during this period.
