History

The Grange Inn was opened in 1843 as the first permanent building at the Grange later to become Hamilton. With extensions, and various proprietors, the Grange Inn remained as an Inn until 1863 when it was flooded by the creek and abandoned (Ian Balck, pers. comm. feb/09).
