This is the finest example of the cultivar known in Victoria. (1994) The tree makes a strong visual statement at the end of the driveway and is part of an impressive stand of conifers including *Abies nordmanniana*, *Cedrus atlantica f. glauca* and *Chamaecyparis lawsonia*.

The tree is located beside Fishers Creek next to the green at the end of the driveway.

St Fillans was purchased by Sir James Munro (Premier of Victoria 1890-92) in the late 1880s and the planting is thought to be from this period.
