Cause of loss

The schooner Achilles and brigs Christian and Elanora were in the open roadstead at Apollo Bay (Victoria) on 30 December 1856, loading sleepers for the Geelong to Ballarat railway, when a strong easterly gale sprang up without warning.
 The Elanora and Achilles were in difficulties almost immediately and both washed ashore in less than an hour, where they became total wrecks.

Statement of significance

<p>It is impossible to assess the archaeological significance of the wreck of the Apollo as the wreck site has not been located. However as it had been involved in the early development of Apollo Bay and the timber industry it has local historical significance.</p>
