# VHR history

Well-known cutter Admiral, together with Greyhound and Emily wrecked in the heavy gales, Maggie sustained considerable damage (Argus 18/04/1867). The Admiral was wrecked with the Emily at Safety Beach, Dromana (Age 20/4/1867). Register closed 31 Dec. 1867. Selective research only indicates a voyage in 1857 from Heads to Melbourne, docking in Yarra.
